




## If you have technical issues with Connect:

The exams are all timed, open book and multiple choice/true false.

There will be **4 exams**, the last of the 4 is the final which is <u>not</u> cumulative. **Exams** will be multiple choice / true false, timed (80 minutes), open book and taken on your home computer (you do not need to come to campus; however campus computers are available to students if needed). <u>Every</u> exam is 25 questions and is worth 75 points for a grand total of 300 points for exams. The exams will be open for a period of about <u>three days</u> and you will need to complete it in one sitting during that time and by the due date.

Click the next the **Arrow** to go to the next question. You can go back to change things. Click the **Book icon** to open up the etext to help find answers. Click **Submit** and the end of the exam.



## Labs:

Throughout the semester, there will be 8 Lab assignments at 5 points apiece for a total of 40 points. You are graded on <u>attempting</u> the lab not the end results as I am looking at effort All Exams and Labs will appear under Assignments. New assignments will appear at different times throughout the semester when they are due.

**Grades** will be calculated on a Points basis. Exams 1, 2, 3, and 4 at 75 points = 300 points. Labs assignment are 5 points each = 40 and 1 point is given for completing each chapter reading= 16 points and answering questions for a **total** of <u>356 points</u> for the semester. The <u>strict</u> usual percentages of 90, 80, 70, and 60 are in place.

So if you have 90% or more of the total points 356 you have an A



#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This lab course is designed for non-biology majors. It introduces students to the structure and function of human body systems. Topics include basic c hemistry, cell structure and function, tissues and various organ systems (e.g. the integumentary, skeletal, muscular, nervous, endocrine, circulatory, respiratory, immune, dig es tive, urinary, and male & female rep roductive systems).

#### **ATTENDANCE**

Grade sanctions may range from an "F" on the examination in which the dishonesty occurred to the maximum sanction of an "F" in the course.
