In this informal, student-centered group, we will explore Alexander Chee's *How To Write An Autobiographical Novel*, a collection of nonfiction essays in which the author reckons with his identities as a son, a gay man, a Korean American, an artist, an activist, a lover, and a friend. Group discussions and reflective and creative writing exercises will help us examine how our own lived experiences interact with and are influenced by our respective identities.

All participants who meet program requirements will receive a book, a stipend of \$75, and access to transfer resources.

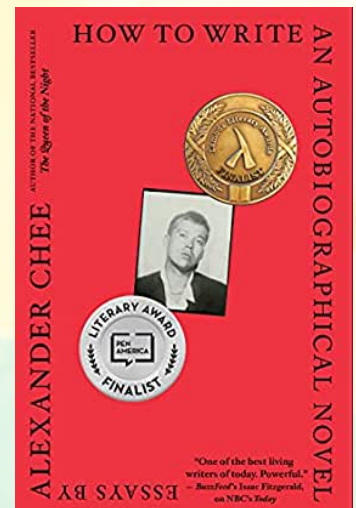
All participants must be current MC students.
