

Muhammad and Nasreen Yaqub, immigrants from Pakistan, brought their family to the Washington, D.C., area in the 1970s. They understand what it's like for families to relocate to a new country in search of opportunity.

"We are just two generations away from a grandfather in India who was an illiterate farmer," says Amer. "My mother was one of the first women from her village to obtain a college degree. My father has a Ph.D. in economics from Princeton University. My parents exemplify the transformative power of education."

perseverance, the Yaqub siblings, Amer, Tahir, and Sajeela—along with Amer's oldest son, Zain established a scholarship fund to support international students at MC. The Dr. Muhammad and Nasreen Yaqub Scholarship honors the life lessons instilled in them by their parents. International students pay nearly three times the tuition as in-county residents, and they do not receive federal financial aid.

"Our family knows that supporting students at Montgomery College offers a great return on investment; a gift of \$2,000 a year goes farther at MC than it would at most other colleges. And we don't have to be millionaires to make a difference right now."
