The Women's and Gender Studies certificate provides a solid foundation of coursework in the discipline. It provides students with the opportunity to specialize in women's and gender studies in preparation for further work at a four-year institution or for professional, personal and academic opportunities. Students in the program must complete a minimum of 12 credits in women's and gender studies-designated courses: WMST 101 - Introduction to Women's Studies (3 credits) or GNDS 101 - Introduction to Gender Studies (3 credits), and 9 additional credits, including a social sciences course, a humanities course, and a general elective, including WMST 101 or GNDS 101 if not taken as a required course. A 200-level course is recommended.
