Pennsylvania does not have a form exactly like the federal W-4 form, since Pennsylvania Personal Income Tax is based on a flat tax rate and everyone pays the same rate of 3.07 percent.

Pennsylvania does not have allowances based on the number of dependents claimed, marital status, age, etc. However, you may be entitled to non withholding of PA personal income tax if you incurred no liability for income tax the preceding tax year and/or you anticipate that you will incur no liability for income tax during the current tax year, according to the Special Tax Provisions of section 304 of the Tax Reform Code, the Service member Civil Relief Act (SCRA) or as a resident of the reciprocal state of Indiana, Maryland, New Jersey, Ohio, Virginia or West Virginia and your employer agrees to withhold the income tax from that state. If you meet these criteria complete form <u>REV-419</u> and submit it to your employer's payroll office along with any required documentation
